## Teaching High School Golfers to Score

The major objective of high school golfers in tournament competition is to put "as low a number as possible on the board." For each golfer, that low number differs depending on a number of factors including experience. The goal is changeable depending on the weather and course difficulty and the goal can be altered once the first goal has been reached, affording the golfer ongoing challenges. Successful achievement of the goals can be accomplished by employing the following techniques.

Of greatest importance, the golfer must be taught to maintain a positive mental attitude regardless of the difficulty they may face. On the course, swing mechanics should never enter the mind. Only two mental keys should be present, tempo and target. Limit the swing error corrections to the practice range. During competition the double focus of t n' t, tempo and target, enables the golfer to play under control and focus on where they want the ball to go. Hitting the target is more easily accomplished when the club is moved smoothly and under control. Under competitive pressure, almost all players will tend to speed up their walk, preshot routine and their swing, making it more difficult to propel the ball to the desired target. The experienced player will recognize this situation and has usually been trained to make the corrections, but what about our high school golfers? Very few have the training and maturity to sense their situation, but as their

coach you can play a key role. By knowing your player well through hours of observation, you can actually see them increase their swing pace. Between holes during tournaments you can then inform the player what is happening and encourage them to slow down and refocus on their tempo and target. By making your golfers aware of such mistakes, they can better use their skills to produce lower scores.

High school golfers, especially those with a great deal of tournament experience, can often set unreasonable goals, putting a great deal of pressure on themselves. Frustration is the usual outcome, frustration and a higher score can demoralize young players. In order to help alleviate this high level of frustration, the golf coach can again intercede between holes to mentally reassure the player of their true ability, and by relaxing, forgetting about holes already played and concentrating on tempo and target for the next few shots, the golfer will enable himself to return to his or her desired level of play.

A final skill essential to producing low tournament scores is proper course management, i.e., hitting the correct club and the correct shot to the correct target. This skill can be taught on the course during practice rounds and observed during competitive rounds. Following the tournament, the coach can make comments and suggestions to the player concerning both good and poorly thought out

shots. It will help if the coach takes a clipboard along to record observations, noting the hole, length of shot, lie of the ball, wind strength and direction, and hazards between the player and his target. Using this technique will make for a more educationally sound ride home, and should be thought of as a most important learning experience for the golfer. You might think of it being similar to going over the results of an exam.

Thus, a coach can observe his or her golfers to see if they make proper course management decisions, control their emotions, maintain a positive mental approach to the round and keep a good swing tempo while focusing on their target rather than their bad luck. As the golfer, with the help of his or her coach, achieves this mental control, their scores will be lowered, to the benefit and satisfaction of both parties.

## Decline of Wisconsin Collegiate Golf Bucking the Trend

Well, it's happening!!! Collegiate golf has now been reduced to three teams in the Wisconsin State University Conference (WSUC). The WSUC Tournament recently completed at the Trappers Turn Golf Course in Wisconsin Dells may well be the last. Only UW Eau Claire, UW River Falls and UW Stevens Point represented the conference and just recently UW River Falls has informed the conference of its intention to drop golf.

The list of University of Wisconsin campuses that have dropped golf from their intercollegiate programs are:

- UW LaCrosse
- UW Milwaukee
- UW Oshkosh
- UW Platteville
- UW Stout
- UW Superior
- UW Whitewater

This has happened at the very time the state's public high schools are developing the largest number ever of golfers, both boys and girls, in the interscholastic programs. According to the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA), in 1989 alone more than 5000 boys and girls participated on golf teams with sports participation figures showing that boys golf ranked 10th -- ahead of cross country, soccer, tennis, swimming/diving and hockey.

The growth of golf in recent years, not only in schools but also in business and with the general public, has truly been phenomenal. A National Golf Foundation Survey shows that 81% of the Fortune 500 chief executives play golf and that 70% admit doing business at the golf course. In a state that boasts the greatest number of golf courses per capita -- it is difficult for many students, coaches and citizens to understand why golf is disappearing from the college scene.

Two explanations most often cited by university officials are: first, the cost of fielding college athletic teams has escalated to the point that

schools can no longer continue to offer the varied sport programs of the past; and second, the advent of Title IX (the need to provide equal athletic opportunities for women) and recent gender equity studies on state campuses have resulted in the perceived need to offer the same number of men's and women's teams.

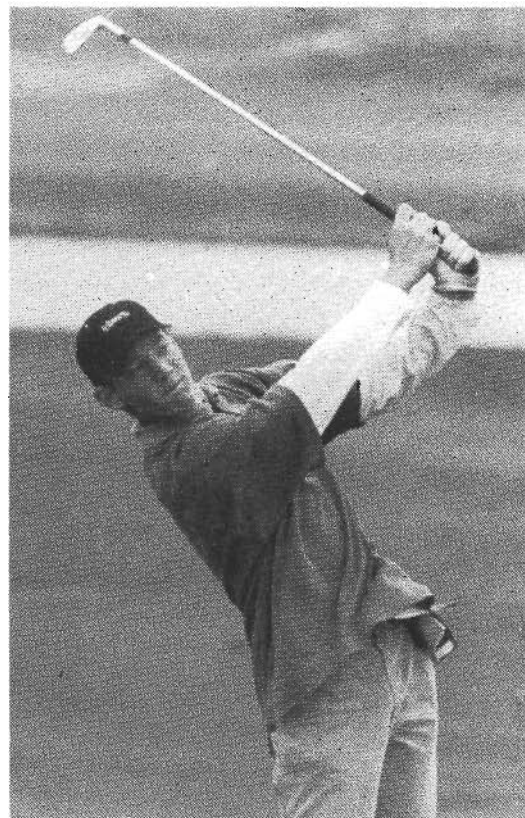
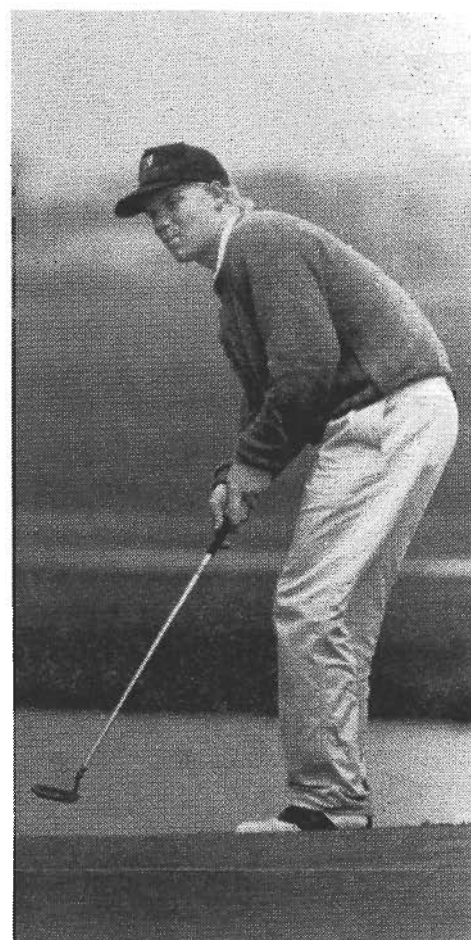
While the above reasons reflect important issues and concerns, let us look at the rationale that many interested persons both in and out of the sport of golf feel should be taken into consideration.

First, that the costs of athletic programs required the elimination of golf teams. While it is true that it costs more to have a golf team than not, it is also true that solving most athletics departments' financial problems by dropping the golf team with their insignificant budgets is not the answer. A far more creative and comprehensive way to financial solvency is clearly necessary.

Second, that the need to solve gender equity questions requires the elimination of the predominantly men's golf programs. To interested students and citizens it seems more productive to take a positive approach to gender equity. Instead of dropping men's golf, add opportunities for women golfers to the existing programs. This approach not only continues opportunities for men but provided additional opportunities for women. This would at the same time provide equal opportunities for women at the very modest cost to the program.

Remember, golf is not a matter of life or death; it's much more important than that.

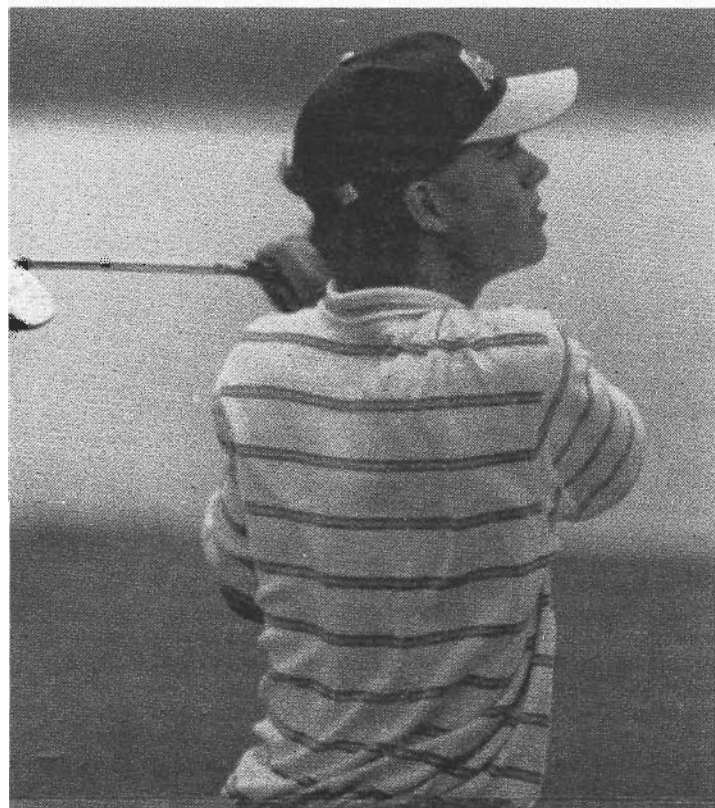


Division I State Champions: Middleton.

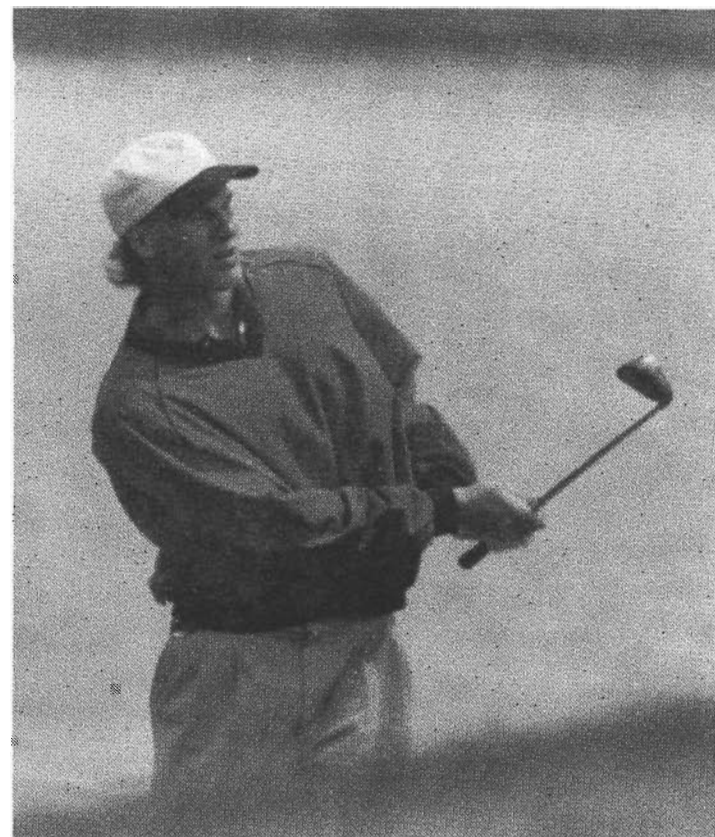

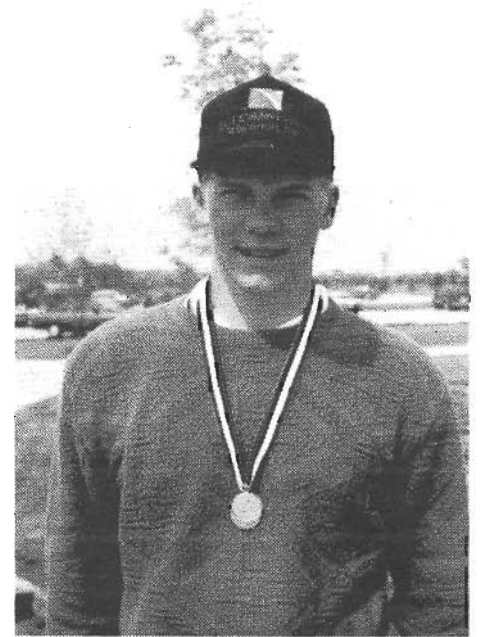
