President's Corner:

While the memory of the summer clinic and annual meeting are still fresh in my mind, I wanted to share my impressions of the 1993-94 high school golf seasons with all of you.

We started the year with the boys WISAA state tournament being played at Camelot in Lomira and the WIAA girls tournament moving to Riverside in Janesville. Both of these tournaments will be played at the University Ridge golf course in 1994. Waukesha Memorial is the WISAA champion and LaCrosse Central repeated as WIAA girls champion.

The change for the girls tournament will not just be a different course. Next year the tournament will be open to WISAA schools as well.

The boys tournament which was concluded June 7th had its share of drama.

Division III was the one noted exception. Osseo-Fairchild almost won the tournament after the first day.

In Division II, the real excitement was for medalist honors. Ryan Quinn and Scott Cole duelled to the last hole and posted the best 36 hole rounds of the tournament. Gale Ettrick Trempeleau finished ahead of Brown Deer for the team championship.

In Division I, Lake Geneva Badger held off Green Bay Preble and Onalaska for the team title. Mike Johnston from Whitnall won the medalist title with a par on the first extra hole.

As I mentioned before, the girls state tournament will now be open to both associations for the first time.

The Spring Clinic will be held on Saturday March 25th in the Milwaukee Area. Coaches told us they could not be released from school and we listened. The great news is who Dave Blake and Mary Beth Nienhaus have lined up for you. We have one of the BEST teachers of golf, Mr. Manuel de la Torre.

We are looking into the possibility of moving the summer clinic/annual meeting to Tuesday. This way everyone can be home on Fathers Day. And next year we will be playing the Links at Lawsonia for our summer tournament.

Do we have any major concerns for 1994 and 1995 seasons? Two problems that your board will be addressing our financing for the state meet and the issue of a dress code for golf.

Hosting the tournament at University Ridge is not a given if the financing is not in place. The Golf Foundation of Wisconsin has underwritten the cost for the 1994 tournaments, but they have not yet committed for 1995. I encourage all of you to help the GFW in any way you can. One way is by being a member of the WHSOCA. Part of your dues (\$13.00 in 1994-95) will go toward

supporting the GFW.

The other concern is a uniform dress code that would be in place for all WIAA and WISAA events. At this time there are conferences with dress codes and some coaches with dress codes. We will encourage the WIAA and WISAA offices to give us a uniform dress code that all can follow.

I have just completed my 8th letter in two days. Most of these letters were to people or companies who helped junior golf in 1993-94. My point is that we are not in this alone. We need your support, we need the board's support and we need the help of key people and organizations.

With all of that said, let me wish you a restful summer. Remember we will have a lot to accomplish in 1994.

John Longerin presented a "**PGA Friend of High School Golf**" award to Dewey DuPont of Hartford CC.

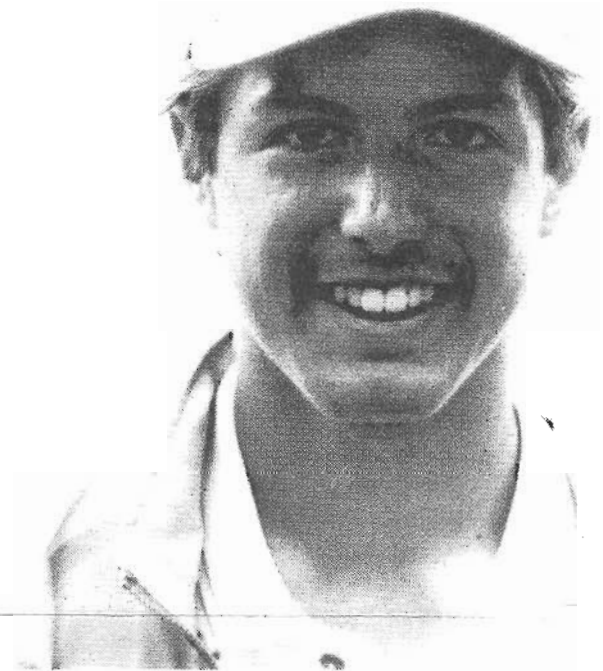
Dave Kilker presented a "PGA Friend of High School Golf" award to Meadow Springs GC of Jefferson - Ken Schakelman accepting.

The Case for Improved (Golf) Coaching Through Certification

Do you know an outstanding coach? Are you one? What makes an outstanding coach? Are most of the golf coaches you know doing a good job? Are there golf coaches not getting the job done? These and other questions are often asked, not only by coaches, but by parents, administrators and school boards. As questions are raised concerning the size and scope of athletic programs resulting from school budget problems, gender equity issues, and availability of facilities, the need for competent coaches for all sports, including golf, takes on even greater urgency.

Clearly, the lack of openings for certified teachers from which coaches could be recruited has been a major factor in permitting school districts to seek non-certified people to fill coaching vacancies. The fact that most states, including Wisconsin, do not require coaching standards or certification for coaches contributes to this growing trend.

A 1986-7 survey conducted by

the National Association for Sports and Physical Education (NASPE) and the National Association for Girls and Women in Sports (NAGWS) indicates a continuation of this trend of hiring non-teachers to coach and requiring limited or no professional preparation for coaches. Concerns of parents, students, and school officials about the educational value and safe conduct of interscholastic athletic programs, including golf, are increasing. These concerns are often the result of potential liability issues raised by hiring coaches who do not possess the necessary coaching qualifications and competencies.

According to the NASPE and NAGWS, qualified, competent coaches need to:

1. Provide for the health, physical welfare and safety of the student athlete by having the necessary knowledge and skills in first aid, care and prevention of athletic injuries;
2. Provide positive leadership for appropriate player behavior by having the necessary knowledge and skills in the psycho-social aspects of coaching.;

3. Provide for appropriate, effective training and conditioning of the student-athlete by having the necessary knowledge of human growth and development;

4. Provide for the application of scientific principles to players that will maximize performance and minimize injury by having the necessary knowledge of anatomy, physiology and body mechanics; and

5. Provide for the theoretical and technical instruction to players in their sports by having the necessary knowledge and skills in coaching organization, theory and techniques.

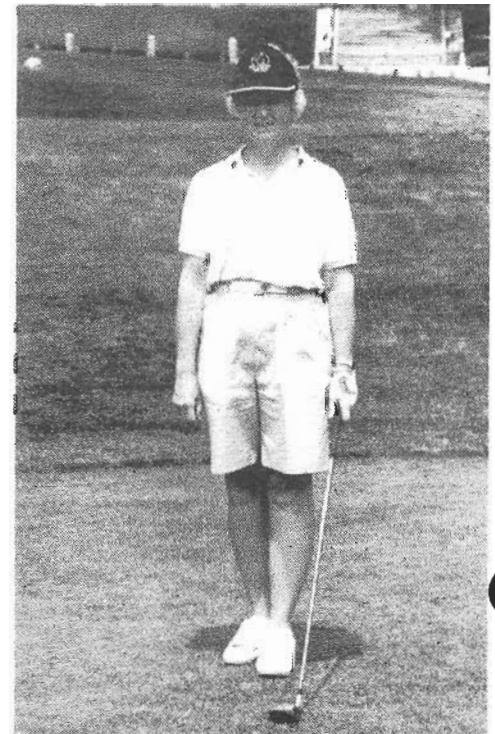
The responsibility to provide the above competencies rests with the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction, the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association, local school and recreational officials, and ultimately with the coach himself/herself. Let's have the golf coaches, themselves, lead the way in upgrading the quality of coaching in Wisconsin. Athletic programs are safest, provide maximum opportunities for positive social-emotional development, and are most enjoyable when competent, professional leadership is provided.

Nienhaus to State Golf Hall of Fame

Mary Beth Nienhaus, longtime girls golf coach at Appleton West High School, was given a tremendous honor at the WHSGCA annual meeting when she was inducted into the Wisconsin Golf Hall of Fame by the WSGA Executive Director Gene Haas. This is certainly the ultimate honor for any golfer in Wisconsin. Gene did a masterful job of recounting Mary Beth's long golf history including her golf career at St Mary's HS in Menasha and at Marquette University. Mary was the Butte de Morts CC club champion from 1963-69, Northeast Champ in 1961, State Junior Medalist in 1960, Public Links champion in 1963 and 1964, State Women's

Champ in 1968 and 1969, is a member of the Ladies Professional Golf Association, was named the National LPGA teacher of the year in 1992 and is President of the Women's State Golf Association.

Mary Beth Nienhaus has given many years of her life to improving golf in the State of Wisconsin and is certainly deserving of this most prestigious honor. We applaud you Mary Beth and thank you for all those who have been influenced by your caring attitude and golf knowledge. You certainly deserve to be a member of the Wisconsin Golf Hall of Fame.

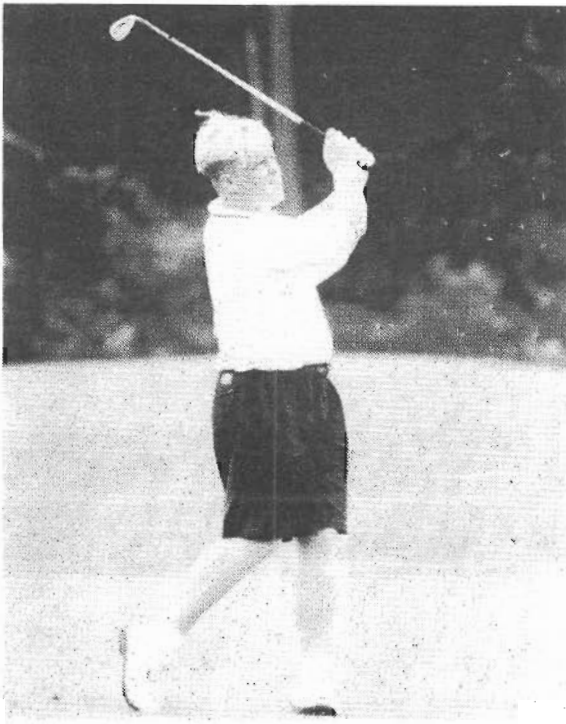
