2006-07 Girls All-State Teams

Carly Werwie, a senior from Kenosha Bradford, and junior Lindsey Solberg from Middleton shared co-player of the year honors from your Coach's Association selection committee. Both players won nearly every event they participated in with Lindsey finishing first at State while Carly was third. Both are repeat first team selections that stood out from a superb field of high school golfers.

Sophomore Lindsay Danielson from Osceola was a first team selection for both of her competitive seasons. Finishing second at State and compiling a sub 38 average score made the choice an easy one. We will be hearing more from her in the future.

Another sensational sophomore landing on the first team was Alyssa Elliott from Madison Edgewood. Alyssa won her regional and sectional tournaments and finished fourth at State. She also finished in the top three in six of the largest invites in the Southern part of the State. Liz Sobczak, a senior from Muskego, is another repeat selection from the '05 first team. Her record was all 1st and 2nd place finishes during the season and 8th place at State.

Our two new additions to the first team are junior, Katie Tabbert from Onalaska, and Kelsie Passolt, a junior from Hayward. Kelsie had eleven first place finishes this year, finished fourth at State and had a sub 40 nine hole average. Katie had twelve first place finishes and also was sub 40 for her nine hole average. Hello Coaches!

The PGA Tour for Jr. Golf is coming to Wisconsin again this summer! The Legend at Brandybrook will host an AJGA National Jr. Tour Event Monday July 9th – Friday July 13th. If you are not familiar with the AJGA it is a non profit Association..... “dedicated to the overall growth and development of young men and women who aspire to earn college golf scholarships through competitive Jr. Golf”. **99% of AJGA members go on to college with over 75% of AJGA players earn a college scholarship of some kind.** 5000 Juniors from 50 states and 30 foreign countries play the AJGA tour.

The 2007 Future Legends is the only event on the AJGA tour that hosts a State Resident Only Qualifier. I negotiated with the AJGA to reserve up to 5 spots in the final tournament field for a local qualifier. We got one spot in the field for every 20 Wisconsin Juniors that play in the local qualifier Tuesday June 19th.

I am asking that you think of the better players from your area high school programs and encourage them to try to qualify for the Future Legends through the Wisconsin only qualifier Tuesday June 19th. The junior need not be an AJGA member to try to qualify. If the junior successfully qualifies for the event then they will be required to meet all AJGA membership requirements. If the junior is lucky enough to get in the National Qualifier on Sunday July 9th, they should still try the Wisconsin qualifier on Tuesday June 19th. If they qualify in the Wisconsin qualifier, the entry fee paid for the National qualifier will be credited.

WISCONSIN'S FIRST GOLF LICENSE PLATE NOW AVAILABLE

MADISON, Wis. (October 30, 2006) – Starting Nov. 1, golfers will be able to display their love of the game and at the same time support junior golf programs with a new “Golf Wisconsin” license plate. The classic white Wisconsin license plate carries the distinctive Golf Wisconsin logo as well as the phrase “Support Junior Golf” and will cost an extra \$25 per year.

“The Golf Wisconsin license plate is a wonderful opportunity for residents to promote the game statewide,” said Joe Stadler, executive director of the Wisconsin section of the PGA. “Golfers in Wisconsin love their sport and purchasing this license plate is a great way for them to show that they’re a fan of the game and help support junior golf programs at the same time.”

75 percent of the funds raised by the plate sales will be used by the Wisconsin section of the PGA to support junior golf programs. The Wisconsin Department of Tourism will use the remaining funds to promote golf.

Rep. Bob Ziegelbauer (D-Manitowoc) introduced the bill creating the plate as a way of promoting Wisconsin as a national golf destination after the success of the 2004 PGA Championship. “We need to keep the momentum going to make our state even more of a destination for golf and to build participation by young people,” said Ziegelbauer. “Wisconsin golf is something that we should always be promoting, especially with so many national tournaments scheduled in the state over the next few years.”

In 2007 the Senior US Open will be played at Whistling Straits and over the next 14 years an additional four major golf events, including the 2020 Ryder Cup, are scheduled in Wisconsin.

“I’m excited about the Golf Wisconsin license plate,” said Wisconsin Tourism Secretary Jim Holperin. “It not only helps us promote golf-related travel in the state, but the PGA’s junior programs are developing future travelers and that’s good for business.”

A Golf Wisconsin license plate application is available online at travelwisconsin.com/golf or can be obtained at Wisconsin Welcome Centers as well as Wisconsin Department of Transportation offices.

Golf Wisconsin is a cooperative effort of the Wisconsin Department of Tourism, the Wisconsin section of the PGA, the Golf Course Owners of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin State Golf Association. In three years the Golf Wisconsin program has helped close to 20,000 young people either golf for free or attend free instructional clinics.

Wisconsin is home to nearly 500 golf courses with more than 400 of them being open to the public. That statistic ranks Wisconsin ninth in the nation for its number of public courses and fifth in the nation for its number of golfers per capita. The special Golf Wisconsin license plate joins a list of more than 80 specialty plates already available to Wisconsin motorists.

January Brings Scheduling and Purchasing Issues from Golf Coaches

Happy New Year to all the Wisconsin high school golf coaches. The new year promises to be as exciting as ever since golf continues to grow in both interest and participation in Wisconsin high schools.

Although the high school golf season may still be a few months away, many questions from coaches preparing for their spring golf season are currently being taken. The questions I receive at the WIAA office are primarily geared toward scheduling and the purchasing of attire and equipment. Questions pertaining to preseason practice opportunities are frequently asked as well. Below I have provided some of the questions and interpretations I have provided on these topics during recent years:

QUESTION: Can schools utilize Nike and Adidas and/or other golf purchase programs to receive reduced savings when purchasing attire and/or equipment?

INTERPRETATION: The fundamental issue regarding the use of any purchase program is that student-athletes, golfers in this case, cannot receive discounts when they purchase apparel and/or equipment because they are members of a team. Article IV—Amateur Status, Section 1—Loss of Eligibility, A., in the WIAA Senior High School Handbook indicates . . . he/she shall become ineligible for all further participation in the school's interscholastic program is he/she: 1) Accepts reimbursement, in any form (a) salary, (b) cash, (c) merchandise of any kind or amount or (d) share of game or season proceeds, for achievement in athletics.

If schools feel it is in their best interest to purchase attire or equipment through a purchase program, they may do so. Coaches and/or Athletic Directors are allowed to purchase these items as school representatives utilizing school funds and then provide them to their golf teams.

QUESTION: I have received numerous mailings from golf production companies such as Nike and Callaway to receive discounts on their merchandise for our golf team and its members. I just want to make sure that if we were to join these programs and purchase merchandise through that program, that we wouldn't be breaking any rules and/or jeopardizing the integrity of our players and the team. Is there any restrictions from me joining these programs and then purchasing merchandise, such as clubs, golf balls, shirts, shoes, etc. that are discounted for our team members?

INTERPRETATION: Typically we similarly address shoe discounts issues and inform that they must be available to any/every student interested in having the benefit of a reduced price on shoes. "A benefit may not be based on performance/achievement/potential - as an athlete." Any student who wishes to "go out" for a program should have access to a discount. These purchase programs are similar to shoe purchases where as long as the offer to purchase is made to the entire student body and/or all students have the opportunity to go out for the golf team, it is OK for golfers to purchase merchandise from them.

If the purchase program allows only school golf teams or only the "varsity golfers" to purchase equipment, attire, supplies, etc. at a discounted rate then there is a problem.

If the A.D./coach wishes to use the school golf budget, donated funds, funds from a booster club, etc., to purchase merchandise through a purchasing program (and the program will allow you to do so) that is OK to do as well.

QUESTION: Is there any way golfers can purchase their own golf shirts at discounted prices through a NIKE purchase program?

INTERPRETATION: As long as the golf purchase program is available to all students in a school, all students have been given the opportunity to participate in the golf program, and the discount is available to all members of each team (JV, Varsity, etc.), discounted prices can be provided to members of the golf team.

QUESTION: Is it legal for a driving range/golf course to offer discount cards to the golf team before the start of the season or outside of a scheduled practice at that facility?

INTERPRETATION: Yes, the fundamental principal of amateur status for this matter is that athletes may not benefit

directly or indirectly based on athletic ability/potential or performance and coaches must allow all students in a school to have an opportunity for this reduced rate. Prior to the season beginning, coaches may provide these cards to members of their teams so long as all students have had an opportunity to join the golf team and they understand that student-athletes cut from the golf team, once practice begins, are able to retain the card.

QUESTION: Is it allowable for a golf course to provide a free membership for the year to student-athletes that make the golf team?

INTERPRETATION: Once again, due to the performance based nature of the membership, this would be a violation of the WIAA's Amateur Status regulation. If any member of the golf team receives a free membership because they are a member of the team, they would become ineligible for all further participation in the school's interscholastic program.

A membership program offered to the entire school is not considered to be in violation of these Amateur Status regulations.

QUESTION: I would like some clarification regarding an issue we have at our school. Our school has set up through a local foundation to pay for our golfers, greens fees for the season and golf membership for the summer. Several coaches wonder how that can be since student athletes aren't allowed to receive free hats, t shirts, food etc. We would like some clarification on this issue since something like this has a cash value of around \$200 per person if they were to pay for it themselves.

INTERPRETATION: One of the dimensions of Amateur Status interpretations is the starting point that an athlete may not benefit directly or indirectly by virtue of athletic ability, potential, performance. So, in part, that translates to mean that they may not receive a benefit which isn't available to every other student. So long as any student can go out for golf and receive the same access to the course (No cuts, etc.) It then is a benefit available to every student at your high school.

Good golfer/bad golfer, if you enjoy the game and go out for the school's program every student in school could golf all summer, too. It becomes more of a perk for students in your school and district and not so much a benefit that's based on performance/achievement in athletics.

Some parallels to shoe discounts for basketball teams, It becomes a problem if "only the varsity team" gets a discount. Now it is clearly a performance-based benefit. If any/every kid in school shows up for day one of the reason and gets the shoe dicount, we consider the "benefit to be available to any student interested in receiving it."

QUESTION: Can we play both our Varsity and JV's in the same invitational on the same day?

INTERPRETATION: *In golf, schools are allowed to play both their Varsity and JV teams in the same invitational on the same day. Coaches and Athletic Administrators are advised to review carefully the MAXIMUM ALLOWED MEETS and the INDIVIDUAL PARTICIPATION LIMITATIONS sections of the WIAA Spring Season Regulations to be certain these maximums are not exceeded.*

QUESTION: Our district is planning a Health Fair to be held on May 6th. This Health fair is being done in connection with our PE program and the fact we won a PEP grant. Many of the exhibits and speakers will be talking on pedometers, heart rate monitors, fitness programs, various workouts, lifetime activities (one being golf), etc. One of the exhibits and breakout sessions we are planning on having is for golf and the fundamentals, reasons why its life long etc. If this is being open to the public and advertised through the city and neighboring communities, is there any WIAA reasons that we can't have this breakout session?

INTERPRETATION: Yes and No, this is a allowed via WIAA Bylaws, Article II, Section 2, A., 1. A school may not assemble athletes or prospective athletes in physical education classes, or some other manner, for purposes of teaching fundamentals, techniques, plays, etc., except during the designated school season of a sport, and during the approved summertime contact period. Since the dates of your Health Fair fall during the designated school season dates for boy's golf, there is no problem with members of the boys golf team attending this exhibit and breakout session of the Health Fair. However, members of your girl's golf team who are freshmen, sophomores and juniors may not attend as this will be a violation of the WIAA coaching contact rule for them.
