We are requesting that coaches not even nominate athletes that have violated their schools athletic code. If an athlete misses any matches because of a code violation during the golf season, that will make that athlete ineligible for all state honors.

Tom Shafranski of the WIAA was able to attend our board meeting on June 23. We discussed several items with Tom. We are going to drop our proposal of a practice round at the regional site in lieu of adding 2 more dates to our schedule. Several other sports have gained approval of additional dates to their schedule and Tom felt that the timing is right for this request. Our coaches advisory with meet with the WIAA in October. We had a discussion about co-op teams mainly in girl's golf. The bottom line is that it is a local issue and if you have a problem with teams in your area that are involved in co-op's, you need to discuss it with your athletic director.

I would like to acknowledge our retiring board members. TJ Dieck, Don Marx, Dick McKichan and Bill Berkholtz have served the board and junior golf in Wisconsin for many years. You all will be missed. Good luck with your future.

Congratulations to all the boys nominated and selected to the Wisconsin High School Golf Coaches Association All-State Teams. Over seventy players were nominated by coaches from throughout the state. The following boys were selected to 1st team, 2nd team, 3rd team and honorable mention.

Brady Keegan - Sr. Eau Claire Memorial High School. Coach is Mike Glassbrenner. Son of Greg Keegan and Rebecca Ruker-Keegan. Co-Player of the Year. Finished tied for 2nd in the WIAA Division 1 State Meet. 1st team all-state last 2 years. Big Rivers Conference Player of the Year last 3 years. 1st team all-conference 2006-2008. 2nd team all-conference 2005. 1st at regional, 2nd at sectional. 4 state appearances, finishing in the top 6, three out of four years. Ranked top 40 of the Polo and Golfweek junior rankings. 1st team all-state hockey team the last two years. Member of Eau Claire Memorial State Hockey Champions this past year. Will be attending the University of Wisconsin on a golf scholarship

Sam Frank - Jr. Kettle Moraine High School. Coach is Mike Duchin. Son of Joel and Lisa Frank. 1st team all-state last two years. Finished in the top five in 11 of 14 regular season meets. 1st in the regional, 2nd in the sectional and tied for 2nd at WIAA Division 1 State Meet. Milwaukee Journal/Sentinel Player of the Year Has

committed to play golf at UW-Madison after his senior year.

Jeff Groose - Sr. Brookfield Central High School. Coach is Brian Scobel. Son of Jim and Caren Groose. 4 time MVP at Brookfield Central. 3 time Greater Metro Conference player of the year. 2nd team all-state as a junior. Won the Whitefish Bay Invite with an even par 71, the GMC Championship with a one under 70 and the Quad at the UW-Ridge with a 5 under 67. He had a 37.4 average with low scores of 34 (9 hole) and 67 (18 hole). He had 7 rounds of 73 or lower. Capped off a brilliant career with an even par 71 - 73 = 144 at State, good for 4th place overall. Jeff will be attending UW-Madison in the Fall.

Mike Sorenson - Jr. Hartland Arrowhead High School. Coach is Tom Tallmadge. Son of Tom & Sue Sorenson. Player of the Year and 1st team all-conference in the Classic 8. Finished tie for 7th in the WIAA Division 1 State Meet 1st Team All-Area Milwaukee Journal/Sentinel. Qualified for U.S. Jr. Amateur.

Ryan Prickette - Sr. Appleton Xavier High School. Coach is Steve Howe. Son of Jeff and Mary Prickette. 2005, 2006, 2008 Eastern Valley Conference Player of the Year. 2006, 2008 Appleton Post Crescent Player of the Year. Was medalist in 7 of the 8 Eastern Valley Conferences meets with a scoring average of 36.1. Medalist at Viking Invitational held at Rolling Meadows with a score of 71. He was also medalist at the Metro Invite with a score of 68. 1st at regional with a score of 70 and 6th at the sectional with a score of 79. All State Team Selection Process

1. Copies of all nominations (numbered) are given to all committee members the day of the committee meeting.
2. Committee members pull out who may be 1st team possibilities. Could be anywhere from 10-20 individuals depending on whom individual members pull out.
3. We sift through each of the 10-20 individuals and try and narrow the field down to 1st team members. Each nomination is discussed thoroughly as to why or why not the nominee should be 1st team.
4. We then go through the same process to determine the 2nd and 3rd teams. Again all remaining nominations are considered each time. All nominations are again thoroughly discussed.
5. After the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd teams are determined, the remainder of the nominations are considered for honorable mention. We do not have a limit on how many players will be selected for this category.
6. Criteria on which players are evaluated:
 - Scores / 9 hole average
 - Place finish in events (state - most important, sectional, regional, invitationals,

- conference, quadrangulares, triangulars, and dual meets).
- Consistency of play (Consideration of course and conditions)
 - Head to head competition
 - Course difficulty
 - Level of Competition
7. The number of players on each team will be 7 for the boys and 6 for the girls. This number can be raised or lowered by one at the discretion of the All State Committee.
 8. Athletes that have missed matches during the present season because of an athletic code violation will be ineligible for All State selection.
 9. All forms must be complete and turned in on time.
 10. Coaches must be a member for the WHSGCA.

Special Awards

Our highlight of the summer clinic is to honor our Hall of Fame coaches. This year we had T. J. Dieck (Coach Milton H.S.) who was most deserving of this honor.

We as a board always feel good when we can honor those fellow coaches that put in many years of service with the 25 year award. We had several this year.

We also have our "Friend of Golf" Award that goes to those outside of the coaching field that have assisted us in our efforts with junior golf in Wisconsin. We had a number of special people to honor at the clinic. They were:

Turned pro in 1985 and was with the PGA until 2000, I have lived in Connecticut, South Carolina, 3 places in Indiana and Las Vegas for 6 years working at golf facilities from Teacher to General Manager.

Now moving to Appleton and coaching the Omro Boys and now the Appleton Xavier Girls starting in August. I did coach the Oshkosh Lourdes Boys for 3 years prior to going to Omro.

Bob Sullivan - I was born and raised in Burlington, and graduated from Burlington High School in 1969, and the University of Notre Dame in 1973. I didn't begin working in a school setting until my early 40's, when I was hired as a school counselor at Big Foot HS in Walworth. Previous to starting at Big Foot, I was employed in a manufacturing business in Burlington.

Most of my golfing friends were in education, so I guess it's no surprise that I gravitated in

that direction.

I began playing golf seriously when I was 12, and was influenced a great deal by my grandfather and father, who played all of their lives. I played golf for four years at Burlington HS, where my coach was hall of fame member Gene Edmundson.
