We also cannot help when a golfer is at "address". The WIAA also approved our proposal of an additional team in Division 2 & 3 from the Regional to Sectional. You can still register for the Spring Clinic and Summer Clinic by filling out the application form on our web site (www.whsgca.com) or find the application within this newsletter.

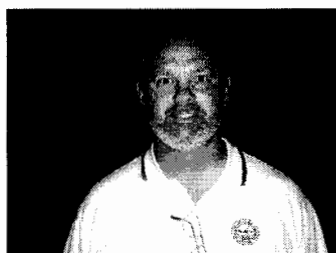

WIAA Rule Issues from Tom Shafranski

The WIAA Board of Control approved two recommendations in Golf at their January 31 meeting in Stevens Point. Both of these rules will go into effect during the Spring 2008 Boys Golf season.

The first recommendation approved allows one designated coach to be allowed to coach during golf competitions. The designated coach may give rule options to their own players anytime, and rule options to other competitors **ONLY** when asked by that competitor. The designated coach is not allowed on the greens or in the bunkers. The person acting as the coach must be under contract with the school as a golf coach.

Players may accept verbal and hand signal advice from their school's designated coach only. Notes, tees, and other items left behind by teammates and/or coaches are prohibited. Coaches cannot align players while the player is at address nor delay Pace of Play in any way. The penalty for violation of the coaching rule is two strokes on the first offense (including a parent(s) or spectator(s) giving any type of advice) and disqualification of player on second offense by same player.

This regulation allows one designated coach to coach during regular season and WIAA tournament series meets. Coaches are encouraged to utilize this new regulation to assist the development of golf skills and rules with their players on the course. Development of Pace of Play regulations are credited with allowing approval of this regulation. Coaches are encouraged to continue to review Pace of Play information provided on the WIAA's School Center website. Pace of Play time determinations can be provided for any course by contacting the WSGA or the WIAA.

A second recommendation approved at the January Board of Control meeting allows an additional team from each WIAA Boy's regional in Division 2 and 3 to advance to the WIAA Sectional Meet. In the past, only three teams from each Regional were able to advance. Since threesomes were organized, an additional team has now been approved. This allows one more school team to experience competition at the Sectional level.

Around March 1, a new video presentation will be available on the WIAA's website-WIAA.TV. This video will include additional information on these new regulations along with other WIAA eligibility regulations, the new USGA Rules and other safety and health related issues. All WIAA Boy's school golf team coaches are required to view this video and have their Athletic Director complete the verification form found on the WIAA's School Center website by Thursday, April 3, 2008.

The coach also cannot align players while the player is at address nor delay pace of play in any way.**

If these proposals (# 2 & #3) pass the above committees, they **would be in effect for the 2008 Boys Golf Season! Stay tuned.**

2007 Girls All-State Teams

Underclass Girls Lead All-State Team

A sophomore, three juniors and a senior were designated as First Team representatives by your Coaches' All-State Committee. Junior, Lindsay Danielson from Division II, Osceola, was chosen Player of the Year for her superb season where she won every event she played in except for one second place finish.

At the State Tournament, she out-distanced the field by three strokes for medalist honors . This is her 3rd selection to the First team.

Alyssa Elliott, a junior from Madison Edgewood, is another three year member of the First Team. Leading a fantastic Edgewood team, she was consistently in the top three finishers and tied for 4th at State.

Tori Bauman, a junior from Nicolet, did not play golf in Wisconsin last year as she attended a golf academy in Florida. She was the North Shore Conference Player of the Year, averaging 77 strokes for 18 holes. The Milwaukee Journal/Sentinel also named Tori their Player of the Year.

Moving up from last year's Third Team was senior Maureen Liddy of Green Bay Notre Dame. The leader of the team that won Division 1, Maureen won their conference tournament, the Regional and Sectional, and was heading to State with a full head of steam. She finished in a tie for fourth place to cap-off an excellent high school career.

A sophomore newcomer to the All-State team, Allyssa Ferrell of Edgerton finished in fourth place at the State tournament. Along with a host of first place finishes during the season and consistent play in the major events, she was chosen as a First Team representative.

USGA Women's Amateur Public Links Championship

U.S. WOMEN'S AMATEUR PUBLIC LINKS CHAMPIONSHIP

Erin Hills, 7169 County Highway O, Hartford, WI, 53027

On June 13-21, 2008, Erin Hills and the State of Wisconsin will host the U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links Championship. This Championship is one of the 13 National Championships conducted by the United States Golf Association.

The format for this event begins with state level qualifying at over 40 sites throughout the United States. Approximately 156 players will then qualify to compete for the 64 spots in the Match Play portion of the Championship. Match Play will begin on Wednesday, June 18 and conclude with the 36 Hole Championship match on Saturday, June 21. These players are among some of the best female amateur players in the country.

Erin Hills and The USGA Championship Committee are seeking eager and enthusiastic volunteers who will help us make this the most unforgettable Women's Amateur Public Links Championship to ever be staged. Volunteers will be needed to fill the many needs of the Championship and to provide hospitality to the players, galleries, and the USGA Committee members. The needs are as follows:

Registration (June 13-15): Volunteers will work in the Erin Hills clubhouse and help the USGA personnel greet the players, assist them with registration, and make them comfortable with the Erin Hills facility.

Spotters, Marshals, and Standard Bearers (June 16-21): Spotters will be on the golf course to assist players with ball location. Marshals will walk with the players and assist with crowd control during the Match Play portion of the Championship. Standard Bearers will carry the standard for each match beginning with the quarterfinals.

Scoring (June 16-21): Volunteers will assist the Official Calligrapher at the scoreboard by reading scores and assisting with the score sheets. Scoring volunteers will be needed to check, receive, and input both 9 and 18-hole scores in the areas near the 9th and 18th greens.

Caddies (June 16-21): Some caddies will be hired by the players (\$40 per day plus tip) to caddie during the Championship. This will include practice rounds and stroke play. The caddie should be available through the week.

The success of this Championship lies in the necessity of having exceptional and eager volunteers. After just four short years, head coach Jim Schuman has brought the Badger program back into national prominence. The 2007 team qualified for the first NCAA regional tournament since 1994, and the fifth place ranking at the Big Ten Championship was the best since 1999.

A familiar name in golf around the state and nationally, Schuman is a noted teacher and competitor. The former head golf professional and director of instruction at Madison's Hawk's Landing Golf Club, Schuman also served as head of instruction at the Rick Smith Golf Academy in Naples, Fla., prior to his Hawk's Landing tenure.

A Madison native, Schuman is a two-time winner of the Wisconsin State Open (1996 and 1999) and was the Wisconsin PGA Player of the Year in both 2001 and 2002. Beyond the state open titles, Schuman also won the 2001 and 2002 Stroke Play and Match Play state events. His fellow state professionals named him the 2003 PGA Teacher of the Year.

Schuman attended nationally-ranked University of Florida where he earned All-American status in 1986, and was an All-SEC choice in 1985 while playing on the Gator's 1985 SEC championship team.

Comprehensive Instruction

Instruction will focus on the fundamentals of the full golf swing, however, each golfer will also receive instruction on the short game and course-management skills. Each golfer will play 54 holes at University Ridge Golf Course with on-course instruction and a golf club evaluation.

The maximum student to teacher ratio is 6:1 and both Head Coach Jim Schuman and Assistant Coach Brian Brodell will be responsible for all full swing instruction. The camps will utilize Vitense Golfland for technical improvement. Vitense has covered hitting bays for utilization during inclement weather.

Instructional Facility

What You Receive

Vitense Golfland offers lighted night practice and play with its expansive golf range, par 3 course, and practice areas. Consistently rated as a "Top 100 Golf Range in America" by the Golf Range Association of America, Vitense features three natural grass tee areas, six natural target greens and a golf range that measures 350 by over 200 yards to allow you to see the complete results of every shot. The new Top-Flite Infinity practice range balls are used and inventory is replaced yearly. The golf range is two tier with 80 tee areas; 18 tees are covered, have southern exposure and are equipped with 3,000-watt radiant heaters to provide comfort in inclement weather.

Vitense Golfland also features three lighted practice putting greens with corresponding chipping and pitching areas. Green-side bunkers allow practice on greenside bunker shots. The practice green and bunkers are available anytime, free of charge. Vitense also offers the only lighted golf course in the greater Madison area- a par 3 golf course with nine holes measuring from 94 to 148 yards. The holes offer changing elevation and are lined with mature pine and hardwood trees. At 1,127 total yards, the course is challenging, but on average takes just slightly over an hour to play and is an excellent way to improve scoring, iron play and the short game.

Each camper will receive world-class instruction, three rounds of golf at University Ridge, a golf club evaluation, lodging for two nights, and eight meals. In addition, the entire group will participate in recreational activities in the evening including miniature golf. Also, each camper will receive an adidas polo golf shirt and a water bottle.

UW Men's Assistant Golf Coach

After Brodell graduated from high school in 2001, he went on to compete for the Badgers in 2001-05 and graduated in December 2005 with a degree in political science.

He won the Wisconsin State Amateur Tournament in 2003 and was named the 1999 High School Player of the Year and the 2000 PGA Junior Player of the Year.

After his four years of eligibility, the Hortonville, Wis. native turned professional and has amassed numerous top-five finishes in various tournaments.

He finished 11th at the 2007 Wisconsin State Open this August and has qualified for the National Assistants Tournament the past two years. Prior to coming back to coach at Wisconsin, Brodell worked at Butte Des Morts Country Club in Appleton, Wis., where his father is also a teaching professional.
