## From the Clubhouse:

### Lots of changes in 30 years

This will be the final president's letter from yours truly. After having served a second two year term, the presidency is being assumed by Wisconsin Lutheran High School coach, Bob Lehninger. Having served as your president for four of the last six years and having completed 30 years of coaching has afforded me an opportunity for a unique look at high school golf in Wisconsin. There have been many changes in those 30 years and almost all of them have produced better high school golfers.

In a major change from 30 years ago, tournament play and many invitationals and conferences now use summer rules as standard procedure rather than winter rules which were used almost exclusively in years past. During the spring 1997 season my team played every event using summer rules! Only one invitational allowed players to "tee up" the ball in the fairway, but the course conditions were excellent, so I instructed my players to just play it as they find it. Certainly, the advent of modern watering systems has produced many excellent conditioned courses allowing "true" golf to be played.

In other changes, the WIAA has

gone from a one to a three class tournament series encouraging smaller populated schools an opportunity to compete in the state tournament. Pairings during the state tournament series now emphasize the team concept rather than the previous "individual" emphasis. Coaching is now allowed from green to tee encouraging coaches to coach rather than play. And, there seems to be a growing interest, among a number of coaches, to allow coaching everywhere.

30 years ago, there was almost no girls golf. Today, there are probably as many Wisconsin females on the LPGA Tour as there are Wisconsin men on the PGA Tour. And where there were few invitationals for males or females 30 years ago, there are any number of them to choose from today. This certainly allows our young players increased learning and playing opportunities.

Another important development has been the creation of our coaches' association. Through this organization a great many opportunities for improving one's coaching techniques have developed, be it through the Spring Clinic, Summer Annual Meeting and Clinic or the Coach Approach. The more we coaches learn, the better we can prepare our golfers for future success. However, another very important aspect of association membership has been the opportunity to meet some of the nation's truly great individuals, my fellow golf coaches. I have been very impressed with the class of the men and women that I have met. I wonder if the residents of our state realize how truly blessed they are to have such

outstanding individuals available to teach their children? There are genuinely nice individuals coaching golf in Wisconsin that I feel deeply honored to have met many of you and served as your president. In our profession, example after example exists of coaches helping other players because it seems the right thing to do. So many of our state's coaches love the game and realize what an incredibly positive effect it has on youngsters, that they put thoughts of beating other teams aside in an effort to just help kids. As an organization we should be proud of every what goes on in high school golf every spring and fall in Wisconsin. Coaches, please realize, you do make a huge difference in young boy's and girl's lives and we need to keep working hard so as to continue to be a positive life force on our players so they can better succeed in their future on this planet.

# The Practice Tee

## Teaching the swing: A Hierarchy

Having concluded a series of articles on the modern golf swing fundamentals, I thought I might review these ideas with an indicator of the difficulty in teaching each fundamental for the average coach with approximately ten years of coaching experience. Remember that playing experience and a lot of study of the golf swing could modify the indicators somewhat. Let us now review the main ideas of that six part series which began with the January, 1996 issue and learn which fundamentals are easy to teach (E), which are moderately difficult to teach (M) and which are difficult (D) to teach. Remember that the more difficult fundamentals to teach are usually the most difficult for the high school golfer to incorporate into his or her swing.

Our first article highlighted the grip (E), set-up position (E) and golf ball position in relation to the feet (E). Please remember that because the hands are the only contact we have with the club, if the hands are improperly positioned on the club it will force the body to make compensatory moves, ie wrong moves, in order to attempt to offset the wrong grip. Without establishing a proper set-up position the body will again make compensatory moves, ie wrong moves, in order to attempt to offset the improper set up. Every time the unconscious portion of our mind senses something is wrong and sends a message to our body to correct the problem while we are swinging the club, the odds of hitting a good shot are diminished drastically. Spend a great deal of your teaching time on grip, set up, alignment and ball position and your athletes will be far more successful.

The second article focused on the start of the backswing. Getting the club moving by turning the upper body while keeping the hands and wrists quiet

is extremely important if the big muscles are to control the club motion (M). In addition, the article stressed keeping the right knee flexed during the backswing (D), turning the target shoulder, left shoulder for a right handed player, behind the ball on the backswing (M) and setting the wrists at a 90° angle before the club reaches the 10 o'clock position (D). Getting behind the ball on the backswing, keeping the right knee flexed and using the big muscles to turn the club back to the top of the backswing are absolutes if the player is to be in the proper position at the top to be able to hit good golf shots.

Article three stressed taking the club back so at the nine o'clock position the shaft points down the target line (D). Also, at the nine o'clock position the toe of the club should be pointing straight up or very close to that position (M). This article then stressed one method of reversing the direction of the club by starting the forward swing with a small hip slide before the club moves forward (D).

Article four taught a different method of starting the forward swing by pulling the club down from the inside before the lower body moves forward (D).

Article five stressed using the right leg in the proper timing sequence of the forward swing (D). This article stressed the importance of the club and body turning forward toward the target together, "connection" (D). In addition the role of the knees was explored (M to D). Finally the role of balance during the swing and how it develops was taught (M).

The final installment focused on the finish of the swing emphasizing the importance of keeping the elbows the same distance apart throughout the swing (M), swing the club at the target (E), and finishing in a balanced position (M). If you as a coach will select the level of difficulty that you can comfortably teach your players, then do further study to learn more so that you can teach more difficult concepts, you will make yourself more valuable as a teacher and your students will be better prepared for competition.

In the course of the annual meeting at "The Springs," the membership gave approval to the idea on a trial basis. Roger Prickett, Watertown, volunteered to head-up the project and has developed the following procedure:

1. All host teams are asked to send results including date, course, par, course rating and team totals to Roger Prickett as soon as possible. Conferences may want to designate one person. No request will be made for the results so if they are not provided, the coach rankers will not have them for their evaluation. You may use any of the following:

2. A web page at [WWW2.watertown.k12.wi.us/Athletics/Golf/WHSGCA](http://WWW2.watertown.k12.wi.us/Athletics/Golf/WHSGCA) (after August 15) will be updated Monday through Friday with the results supplied by the coaches. The results will be divided by classes during the boys season. Any coach may view or down-load the results.
3. Using the twelve regions already created by the Association, Roger is looking for one volunteer from each region to act as the ranker for the girls season and three volunteers from each region for the boys season.



(Class A, B, C). These volunteers must have access to the Internet, be willing to review the results, and E-mail their rankings to Roger on September 2, September 23 and October 21. Boys dates will be announced later. We will rank 15 teams for the girls season and 10 teams in each class for the boys season. Rankers will be responsible for only one class during the boys season. All coaches are encouraged to discuss appropriate placements with coach rankers.

4. Roger will compile the results and provide the rankings to the newspaper's wire service. They will also be placed on the web page.

If you would like to volunteer as a ranker, provide to Roger in any of the above modes, your name, your school name, E-mail address, the season (Girls, Boys, Both) and class (A, B, C) if the boys season. If more than one name is received for a given district, the ranker will be chosen by lot. Rankers will be listed on the web page as soon as they are chosen.

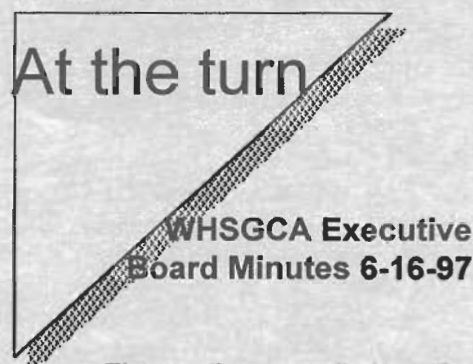


