Two more of the many highlights of the June clinic were the announcement of the raffle winners and the presentation of the special awards. Thanks to Scott Meyer, T. J. Dieck, and Don Marx for organizing another successful raffle, the association's No. 1 moneymaker. Congratulations to Stu Anderson for being selected to the coaches Hall of Fame. Stu was a very successful coach at Oconto Falls for 34 years. Don't forget to nominate retired coaches whom you feel are deserving of this prestigious honor. The Practice Tee

What Makes a Good High School Golfer?

While every person is different, I believe there may be certain characteristics that define most very good High school golfers. It is probably rare that any one high school golfer would be strong in all of the following characteristics. More likely, an excellent high school golfer would have more of the following characteristics or would have stronger characteristics than a poor player. And there are, of course, always exceptions to the rule. But usually, most outstanding high school golfers would exhibit more of the following traits to a stronger degree than would lesser players.

1) I believe that most outstanding high school golfers would tend to have a relatively high degree of intelligence, for golf is a thinking game as much as it is a physical game. He or she who can think at a high-level, without over analyzing, would have a better opportunity to problem solve their way through the various obstacles that a golfer faces during a competitive round. Good, strong, logical thinking, while keeping one's emotions in check during a competitive round, is essential if a player is going to be able to produce low scores. During my 33 years as a high school golf coach it has seemed that most of the excellent players had an ability to keep their emotions in balance. While I can think of several who had strong emotional outbursts from time to time, the vast majority, by their junior year, had things pretty much under control. And it would seem to me that the greater one's intelligence, the better the chance of controlling one's emotions.

2) Certainly having a positive attitude is very crucial to becoming a good player. Golfers with a good attitude have a better understanding that they

are not perfect nor do they have the ability to consistently strike perfect shots. Ideally, great golfers have a yearning to improve and will thus exhibit a desire to understand why some shots turned out poorly and they will want to know what they can do to prevent those poor shots in the future. Great players must be able to balance impatience with their imperfections and a positive desire to learn how to strike good shots more frequently. This particular trait is probably more prevalent among players who have a higher degree of intelligence and who show a strong work ethic.

3) Great players need to have an excellent work ethic, because playing the game at a high-level requires a tremendous time commitment. I would doubt that players in most sports are practicing the 40 or 50 hours a week that is necessary if one expects to be a great golfer. Excellent players by necessity are usually individuals who are willing to be by themselves when they practice, either because it allows them to concentrate more fully, or because there are so few around whose passion for the game drives them to make the necessary commitment to excellence. Thus, being what one might call a "loner" is an advantage of sorts to the development of golf excellence.

4) Because of the tremendous time commitment necessary to produce a great player, having a passion for the game is quite necessary. If a player's coach or his or her parents have to constantly nag a player to practice or play, then in all probability that player does not have the passion necessary to make the time commitment required for becoming an excellent golfer. If on the other hand, you have young men or women with a true passion for the game, encourage their parents to provide as much opportunity as possible to nourish that passion. In addition, it is important that you also provide as much opportunity as is possible, during the high school golf season, for that player to improve. Take careful note during your practices of which players are easily bored and which want to keep hitting practice balls. Allow those whose passion or focus is limited to "take a break" or go buy a soda then tell those with a greater interest that

you would like to see them hit a certain type of shot or use a certain club. Those whom you are allowing to take a break will be grateful, while those you are watching will be proud that you are paying special attention to them and will usually be quite willing to "show their stuff." Who knows, the player's with less passion may decide to focus more in order to get your attention. That would certainly be a positive way to create more passion for the game among those whose interest might not be as great.

5) Great players have a high-level of self-confidence, which is developed through hard work and results in golfing success. However, to golfers who like to brag to others about how great they are, I usually have two pieces of advice: 1) Keep your mouth shut and let your sticks do the talking for you. 2) Remember, half the people you are bragging to could care less, and the other half hope you play poorly. Usually, only you, your coach and your parents hope you do well. Even many of your own teammates will secretly take satisfaction in your poor play, especially if they play poorly, because it helps them feel better. Players who need to tell others of their ability are either immature or don't really have much confidence in themselves and are looking for someone to verbally boost their confidence level.

The self-confidence that we as coaches want to promote should be a quiet confidence. Golf course confidence, encourages the player to clearly visualize the shot before addressing the ball, and allows the player a high-level of shot commitment prior to and during the swing. Many players, especially the younger ones, need their confidence bolstered, which is of course your job as their coach. Reminding them of a previous round well played, or practice shots properly executed will hopefully give them a greater ability to positively visualize good shots during their round. And certainly good visualization is essential to good scoring. However, if they play well, they should try to keep their excitement on a low key until you can talk with them out of earshot of other players who may have experienced less success that day. It is most important to praise those players for their success, but it is especially important for

you to let them know that the success they achieved should come as no surprise since they have worked hard for this moment. Here then, is your opportunity to impress on them the direct correlation between hard work, self-confidence and success.

The above five characteristics, while by no means a complete list, are certainly important for successful golfers to possess. Not all outstanding high school golfers are strong in all five areas for they are still an unfinished product needing more time, experience and aging to nurture their skill level. As high school golf coaches we need to ask ourselves: What can we do to further develop these traits among our players so they can better achieve their true potential as competitive golfers?

Allstate playing team nomination information:

Beginning with the 2000-2001 school year, several major changes will take place with the nominating procedure for the boys and girls Allstate playing teams. Recently the committee in charge of selecting the Allstate boys playing team agonized for over five hours, trying to select the most deserving candidates and placing them on the appropriate teams. The following day the teams were announced at the annual meeting. It was discovered later in the day that one young man's nomination form was incomplete. His coach had neglected to record, on the nomination form, one invitational score. Complicating matters was the fact that this young man was selected to the Allstate first team, and the unrecorded score, apparently in the high 80s would have probably resulted in his being named to the second Allstate team. Because we were not able to get confirmation of his score, he remains on the

first team, but his placement is certainly tainted by the less than complete nomination form. Whether his coach accidentally or purposely failed to record this score is unknown. The committee also wondered how many other nomination forms were incomplete.

As a result of this situation the September issue of the Coach Approach will contain a new nomination form for the upcoming school year, which will require you to record All competitive scores. Failure to do so will result in the rejection of that nomination form. In addition, it is extremely important that ALL coaches who host an invitational Must fax or mail a copy of the results to Lee Kaczmarek in c/o the Coach Approach so that all player's scores can be verified during the selection process for the Allstate playing team. Should the selection committee not have verification of invitational results from a host coach or another coach appointed by him, scores from that tournament would most likely have to be ignored during the selection process. It will require a very small time commitment to fax the results of your tournament to 262-970-3720.

Coaches, please, make sure that your nomination forms are complete and post-marked by the date listed at the bottom of the form. You'll notice there is no spot to record the player's state tournament results. The committee will have that information available during the selection process. Also, make sure the entire top portion of the nomination form is complete. Again, incomplete forms will be rejected!

Academic Allstate nomination procedures:

Please pay close attention to the deadline dates on the Allstate academic nomination forms. Those states are Absolute deadlines. Nomination forms received after the deadline date will be rejected. The Wisconsin High School Golf Coaches Association executive board very much dislikes creating absolute deadlines, but when nomination forms are received in July and even as late as August, long after the academic Allstate teams have been announced, we can do nothing but hold our fellow coaches accountable for their lack of organization and foresight. The March

15th deadline for the girl's academic Allstate team allows the members of the executive board who are responsible, to compile the list, create and send out the certificates of achievement, and send a press release to the appropriate media. They are trying to complete their task prior to the beginning of their spring coaching responsibilities. If all coaches could remember to send their girls Allstate academic nomination forms shortly after first semester grades have been made available, it would be a huge help to the committee members in charge.

Pay very close attention to the deadline date on the boy's academic Allstate nomination form. This is also an absolute deadline and with the Allstate playing team nomination forms due and the end of the school year occurring at approximately the same time, responsibilities can be overlooked!

Finally, please make sure that you are using the correct nomination form and forwarding it to the correct party responsible for its acceptance. The name and address can be found in bold print at the bottom of the nomination form. The form is quite simple, with easy instructions to follow, so if you take your time and read carefully, just like we tell our students to do, mistakes can be eliminated! This article will be repeated in the first newsletter of the new school year due out in September. Please retain this newsletter so you will have this most important information available to you at the appropriate time. Thank you!

The Boys 2000 All State Team Named

The Wisconsin High School Golf Coaches Association recently selected the boys all state playing team for 2000. Leading the way is **Brian Brodell** from Appleton North and **Dylan Esterling** of Green Bay Southwest who were selected as Co-Players of the Year. Joining them on the first team are **Charlie Delsman** from Hartland Arrowhead, **Neil Johnson**

of River Falls, **Chad Kovalesski** of New Richmond and **Neal Gruszczynski** from West Allis Central.

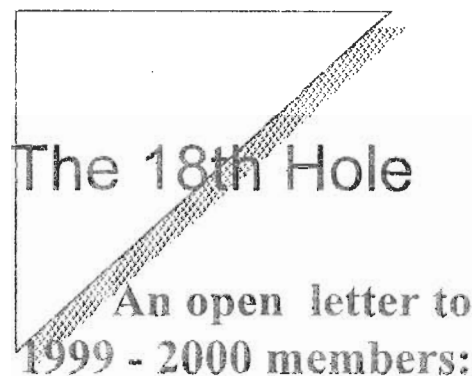
For the spring season Brian's scores included 5 first places and 1-second place in tournaments with scores of 71, 73, 69, 79, 75 & 72. At the State Tournament, Brian tied for third place with a 148 total. Dylan also had an outstanding season with 5 first places and 1 fifth place finish on scores of 76, 72, 68, 76, 73 and a 36.8 conference meet average. He took second place at the state meet with a 145 total. Charlie Delsman's scores varied from a 73 to a 78 and his 149 total placed him 6th at the state meet. Neil Johnson recorded three first place finishes including scores of 68, 70, 72, 72, 74 & 76. A 154 at the state tournament netted him 14th position. Chad Kovalesski placed first 5 times during the season including a winning 150 score in the Division 2 portion of the state tournament. Other highlights included scores of 72, 74, 74, 74, 75 & 77. Neal Gruszczynski's outstanding season included scores of 72, 74, 74, 75 & 78 and a tie for seventh place at the state meet with a 150 total.

Because of the number of outstanding players in the state this year, selecting members to the first team was exceedingly difficult as there were a number of other outstanding players whose records included low scores and winning performances in a number of meets. However, the members of the all-state first team demonstrated an ability to take it low and to put consistently good numbers on the scoreboard.

On the all-state second team was Fond du Lac's Dallas Diener, the W.I.A.A. Division Champion with an outstanding score of 141. Joining him were Andrew Dustan of Wausau West, Plymouth's Nate Colson, Matt Bark and Wes Hansen of Washburn, Jeb Grueneberger of Kickapoo and Jeff Henderson of Reedsburg.

On the third team were James Gempler of Madison Edgewood, Matt Jackopin from Hartland Arrowhead, Derek PirkI from Stoughton, Ryan Hurab and Jon Friess of Brookfield Central, Brian Giese from Prairie du Chien, Mike Lowry of Oregon and Brett Barkelar of D.C. Everest.

The complete listing including the Honorable Mention team is listed elsewhere in the issue. Congratulations to all those selected for their fine accomplishments during a great season.

Charting a new course Golf course owner intends to donate the land for dream Winagamie expands for new youth program

It was about a year ago when Mary Beth Nienhaus sat down one night, gathered up the evening newspaper, and read a story that would significantly alter her life.

This story, which appeared in the Post Crescent, was about The First Tee, a national program designed specifically to create golf facilities that are accessible and affordable, with an emphasis on introducing kids of all races and economic backgrounds to golf.

The next day she was on the phone with Steve Quale, executive director of the Golf Foundation of Wisconsin and the point man for the state-based First Tee programs.

"I said, 'Steve, I've had this dream, and I want to learn more'" said Nienhaus who is the head golf professional and owner of Winagamie Golf Course in Neenah.

The learning curve was quite high, for in the next couple of months, Nienhaus

decided to cut short a 32 year teaching career, the last several at Appleton West High School, and donate all her energies to her dream.

"I remember the date in February (when resignation letters were due) and I had my letter in one hand and the phone in the other and said, 'Steve,' is this project going to fly this fall", the 56-year-old Nienhaus said. "He assured me it is."

Nienhaus is not only donating her time and talent, but money and land as well. She is contributing \$200,000 out of her own pocket toward the \$1.2 million project. She is also donating roughly 75 acres of land which, originally, was slated for 40 home subdivision. Finally, upon her death, it's her intent to turn the entire facility over to the Golf Foundation, with an agreement specifying it will remain a First Tee site/public golf course forever.

"Mary Beth is being incredibly generous, in terms of cash contributions and her long-term commitment to the foundation," Quale said. "She's doing this because it's the appropriate legacy for someone who spent their entire life teaching kids and golf. We couldn't be more grateful for what she's doing here."

Staffing and our allocation for the project breaks down as follows:

Roughly \$700,000 of the \$1.2 million has been raised. Besides Nienhaus' donation the Golf Foundation and Herbert Kohler president and CEO of the Kohler Co., have also contributed. Kohler's donation comes from \$500,000 raised through the grand opening of Whistling Straits. As well, \$1 of each greens fee for the first three years of Whistling Straits has been earmarked for First Tee programs.

The First Tee will look to local corporate sponsorship for the remainder of the funds. There are several different programs available, with several sponsorship benefits tied in.

Nienhaus said a portion of the greens fees for those playing Winagamie has also been earmarked for the First Tee. That program will become permanent, she said, though the amount donated from each greens fee has yet to be determined.

The First Tee, through contributions from several national golf manufacturers, will provide Winagamie with 50 sets

of clubs and bags, as well as golf balls.

Nienhaus will serve as director of golf at the facility, managing the First Tee program as well as running Winagamie Golf Course. The First Tee will provide her with additional help for instruction. Nienhaus will also assist Jason Manke, who comes to the First Tee from the TPC and Sawgrass in Ponte Vedra Beach, Florida, in developing a curriculum and programming for the states' four First Tee sites.

"All my life I've been involved with kids, through education and golf," said Nienhaus, who just two years ago donated \$200,000 to help build the Nienhaus Sports Complex for West High School. "It's just the kind of natural thing for me to do this."
