New Program @ UW Stout

I am writing to the high school golf coaches in Wisconsin to seek your assistance in announcing to your student athletes and others our new B.S. in Golf Enterprise Management at UW-Stout in Menomonie, Wisconsin.

The B.S. in Golf Enterprise Management (GEM) at UW-Stout is off to a fantastic beginning. Approved by the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents in October, 2005, the four-year B.S. program already has over 70 students and the Specialization in GEM (18-22 credits) has 12 students. These students have transferred to UW-Stout from other colleges in the Midwest as juniors or seniors, or have transferred from other academic programs at UW-Stout. The majority of these students have previous work experience at golf courses. Amazingly, the first graduates of the GEM program will be May 2007.

The primary objective of the program is to prepare graduates for careers in golf course management. However, graduates of the GEM program will also be prepared for entry-level management within corporations that manage multiple courses, golf retail businesses, tourism businesses, and many other golf-related businesses.

Students receive a comprehensive education with courses in business, customer service, food and beverage and retail management, in addition to golf-specific content in customer development and retention, golf course design and turf management. For a better idea of the GEM program, go to:

Additionally, UW-Stout is in the final stage of approving men's and women's varsity golf teams. We expect full approval by this spring.

We have already begun an active campaign to secure academic scholarships for GEM students.

Coupled with the varsity teams, the GEM program is an ideal opportunity for young men and women in Wisconsin who have a passion for golf. Even though it is running a bit late for fall 2006 admissions, we expect to have amply opportunities for fall 2007 admissions.

Some words about Andy Hansen - Our 2006 Player of the Year!

Andy is a three year varsity player. His career 9-hole average is 38.60. In the 48 year history of Homestead Boys Golf, that is a school record. Andy also holds the school record for low single season scoring average of 37.45. He beat Tim Grogan who played at UNLV and is currently the coach at Marquette University.

This season Andy was Division 1 medalist at the Janesville Invite with a score of 73. Andy also won the North Shore Conference Final at Washington County Golf Course with a score of 70. Andy was First Team All North Shore Conference. Andy placed second at both Regionals and Sectionals. Andy won the individual state tournament with a record two day total of 136. That is a record once held by Scott Cole of Richmond who shot 140 in 1990. Andy also tied the course record at University Ridge with a 65. That score is also a WIAA state record at the state tournament.

Andy was also named the Southeastern Wisconsin, Player of the Year by the Milwaukee Journal Sentinal. He was the team MVP as well as the Homestead's Booster Club winner of the "Highlander Award" which is awarded to the Person of the utmost character, honesty and integrity in each sport. He was voted this award by his teammates. Andy is the son of Mark and Carlene Hansen and will attend Parkside University next year.
