

# **2019 RULES / PENALTY AREAS**

## THE COURSE

## WHAT STAYED THE SAME?

Courses will still be marked with red (formerly known as a lateral hazard) & yellow (formerly known as a water hazard) paint and stakes.

#### WHAT'S NEW?

The term "hazard" has been removed from the Rules of Golf. These areas are now known as red penalty areas and yellow penalty areas.

A course or a committee may now choose to mark the entire course in red, always offering the option of lateral relief.

## PLAYING THE BALL

#### WHAT STAYED THE SAME?

When playing a ball from a penalty area, a player <u>DOES NOT</u> receive relief from an immovable obstruction (e.g. sprinkler head, concrete slab, foot bridge, etc.).

When playing a ball from a penalty area, a player **MAY** move movable obstructions (ex: rake, bench, bottle, etc.).

#### WHAT'S NEW?

When playing a ball from a penalty area a player <u>MAY</u>:

- Ground his/her club (including during a practice swing)
- Move loose impediments (ex: sticks, pine straw, leaves)

## RELIEF OPTIONS

#### WHAT STAYED THE SAME?

When in a penalty area (red or yellow) a player has the following relief options, each under the penalty of one stroke:

- Stroke-and-Distance Relief 17.1d(1) • Play from area of previous stroke
- Back-on-the-Line Relief 17.1.d(2)
  Back on the line drawn from hole to entry point of the penalty area

When in a red penalty area, a player has the two relief options listed above, plus a third option under the penalty of one stroke:

- Lateral Relief 17.1d(3)
  - Two club lengths from entry point, not nearer the hole

When in a penalty area (red or yellow), a player may play the ball as it lies.

## WHAT'S NEW?

When in a red penalty area a player <u>NO</u> <u>LONGER</u> has the option of opposite side relief.

\*\*\*A committee may make a local rule allowing opposite side relief as an option.\*\*\*
